We immediately decided to explore the app separately for a few minutes to get a feel of the features. Because there is no way we can split the app with each other without both us know what the features are. This was not a very user friendly app, and so it didn't make things easy for us. We both started looking at the manual to understand more of the features. Selim Mia wanted us both to find bugs and approve each others issue. No problem since the moderator approved it.

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The biggest obstacle we faced was we didn't know each others testing skills. That is a big drawback when you are doing pair testing. Since its about trust. Then there was this communication issue. A lot of the time I was asking questions and he was not responding, since he was busy testing too. I did the same. It wasn't intentional of course. That caused a lot of problems because I wasn't able to reproduce some of his bugs, and I wasn't able to get my point across. I guess its all expected since in a new team like this, there is always storming at the beginning :) In this particular case norming didn't get much of a chance, until the time was almost up :)

About testing:

Instead of reading help, I start using it. That's where I got lost, no way to input what I want to hide and close. No testability in DP. Even so, there's still plenty of menus and buttons to click, so I found a couple of usability issues without knowing how DP actually works.

Then I switch tasks with Ashish, I reformat report, he tests. I got some time to take a look at Help and know how DP works.

Help should be the first thing to start with for low usability product, that's how you know it and find its core function to test and to explore.

About pairing:

It's the first time for me to pair with someone, I think it's a double connection of managing, doing what I do and knowing what he is doing. We didn't communicate well at first, but with typewritten notes, we do share the same view of report. Then we're getting better, knowing each others' status and next step.

As pair testing on skype, the hard part is to communicate, I'd say a shared clock and desktop screen would help us a lot.

The second hardest part is about planning, to locate which feature is highest priority and we should test first.

Without this, we find more usability issues instead of core function issue in 50 minutes which we should do better.
