[4/23/2011 6:05:58 PM] Michael Larsen: Not being critical, I don't think we've done anything that would be considered "tampering" or destructive, but it limits the ability to focus on certain avenues.

[4/23/2011 6:06:34 PM] European Weekend Testers: @Lalitkumar we had last time a session with a mission that was not really possible to accomplish :) We have those quite a lot in work

[4/23/2011 6:06:50 PM] Kristjan Uba: Limiting factors: tools mainly for latin charset, tested only on client side, no network logging, ToS factor, (probably only) on desktop machines - would be good to test on mobile devices as well

[4/23/2011 6:06:54 PM] European Weekend Testers: @Michael what do you mean?

[4/23/2011 6:07:58 PM] Michael Larsen: there's a lot more aggressive testing we could have done, but chose not to do.

[4/23/2011 6:08:13 PM] annabaik: I think it's worth considering how your testing might impact others when using a shared environment. E.g. I've sometimes worked in groups that hosted the test environments on the same server as live, so that's relevant to a work environment too.

[4/23/2011 6:08:13 PM] Kristjan Uba: we also did not test chat behaviour during a call - does a long chunk of text change the voice quality ? etc

[4/23/2011 6:08:32 PM] Michael Larsen: that's all. It's not a bad thing. we decided that, for the sake of being a good neighbor, to go full throttle with things that could be potentially destructive.

[4/23/2011 6:08:39 PM] Petteri Lyytinen: about history length. I don't know how long Skype preserves chat logs but I have one very active work-related group chat where people have been talking since October 23rd, 2009 and I just told Skype to show me the chat history "from beginning"

[4/23/2011 6:08:45 PM] Michael Larsen: Under the circumstances,I think that was appropriate.

[4/23/2011 6:08:47 PM] Kristjan Uba: putting the stress on skype program on the OS side and then seeing it handle the big input

[4/23/2011 6:08:55 PM] Petteri Lyytinen: and now Skype is fetching the history, it's been doing so for a few minutes already
